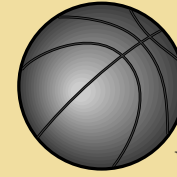

College of Wooster head coach Lisa Campanell Komara will direct the Wooster Basketball Camp for Girls. Coach Komara joined the Wooster staff in 1997-98. She has acquired the national recognition of rebuilding programs, having revived three other programs throughout her 24 years as a collegiate head coach. Her '93-'94, '94-'95, '95-'96, '96-'97 teams were regionally ranked while posting a 71-29 record. Coach Komara has guided teams to one NCAA tournament appearance and two ECAC post-season appearances.

As Director of Wooster Basketball Camp for Girls, Komara directs the day-to-day operations and is actively involved in individual instruction and lecturing. She holds a Masters degree from West Virginia University in physical education and sport administration. Her expertise, enthusiasm, and teaching methods will benefit each camper.

## Individual Instruction

Making sure every young woman receives individual instruction is the main goal of our camp. With a ratio of one coach for every seven campers, individual attention to the fundamentals is assured.

## Experienced Staff

The staff is composed of successful high school and college coaches who have proven their ability to teach. These people place great emphasis on the highest principles of athletics. Outstanding college players will serve as camp counselors. The camp offers twenty-four hour dormitory supervision.

## Outstanding Facilities

The Armington Physical Education Center, with four full-size college courts, is the focal point for training. While meals and recreation revolve around Lowry Center, the entire 240-acre campus, including the pool in the Physical Education Center, is available to the campers.

**The Camp** will provide the atmosphere where a young woman can receive excellent instruction, proper supervision, and enjoy the fellowship of other campers who want to learn more about basketball. Campers are grouped by grade level for teaching and competition.

## Grades 4-12

Wooster Basketball Camp is open to young women who will begin grades 4-12 after **September 1, 2008**. Session I runs **June 15 - 18, 2008**, and Session II runs **July 13-16, 2008**.

## Registration and Check-Out

Final registration for Camp is held between 1:00 and 2:45 p.m. on the first day of Camp at the Armington Physical Education Center on The College of Wooster

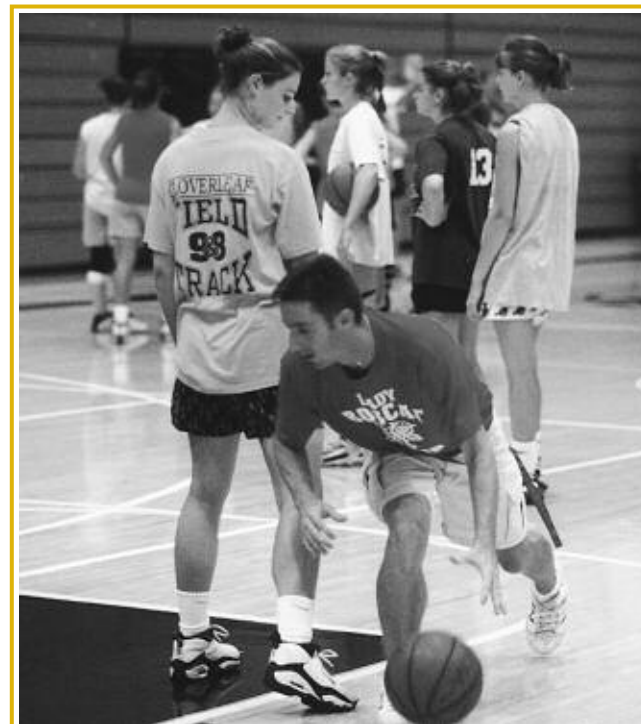
campus. **Room assignments will be made prior to check-in. ALL housing consists of TWO campers per room. There will be NO triples or quads available.** An awards ceremony begins at 7:00 p.m. prior to check-out. Check-out is between 7:30 and 8:00 p.m. on the last day of camp.

## Fee

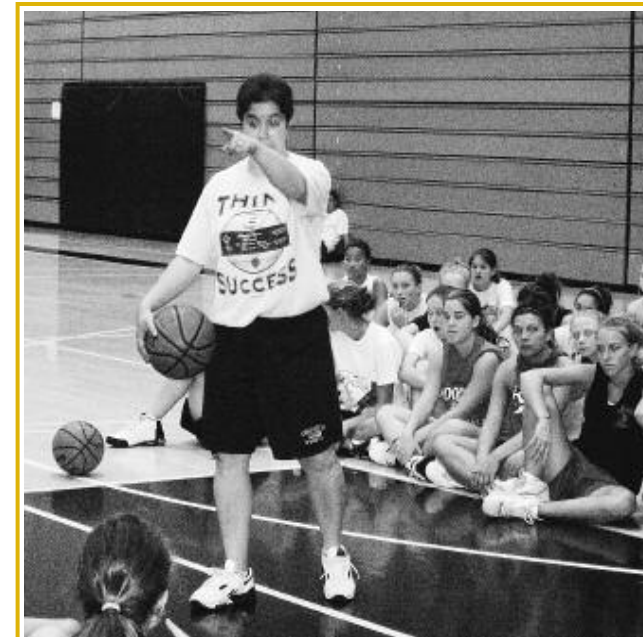
The fee for the one-week session at Wooster Basketball Camp for Girls is \$415.00 This covers everything but the individual's spending money. A \$200.00 deposit must accompany the registration form. The balance can be paid at registration time. Parents who desire may pay the full \$415.00 in advance. If we are informed of cancellation 14 days prior to the beginning of camp, we will refund the deposit minus a \$50.00 processing fee.

## Evening Activities

While away from the basketball court, campers will be involved in evening activities such as bowling, swimming, karaoke, and the ever-popular pizza and dance party for the whole camp and staff.



Norwayne High School head coach **Scott Norman** is an experienced member of the Wooster Basketball Camp for Girls. Coach Norman has helped hundreds of campers become better players from camp.



Former WNBA player and current Orrville High School Coach **Marci Alberts** is a veteran staff member of the camp. She provides ball handling and shooting instruction to all campers. Her enthusiasm and teaching experience encourages the athletes to become better players.

## Equipment

Equipment provided by the camp includes a Camp T-shirt and a regulation indoor/outdoor basketball. The camper should bring her own playing clothes, basketball shoes, and socks. Please make sure these items are labeled. Each person should also bring her own sheets, light blanket, fan, pillow, alarm clock, watch, swimming suit, and informal clothes to wear around campus.

## Medical Facilities

The medical facilities of the Wooster Community Hospital are within one mile of the College campus in case of any emergency. Each camper is covered by accident insurance. A full-time trainer is on duty throughout each session.

## Busy Schedule

The morning sessions emphasize individual improvement, both offensively and defensively, including station-circuit work, lectures, demonstrations, and drills. Girls will be divided into groups according to age, size, and skill level. The young girls will be taught basics; middle group will be

taught fundamentals and an understanding of the game; the older group will focus on fundamentals as well as developing their position skills. After lunch, team play will be the emphasis. During free time, the camper can take advantage of the College's facilities for tennis, golf, swimming, bowling, and pool; or just relax and meet new friends.

An evening session typically consists of team competition emphasizing the skills learned during camp fundamental sessions. The younger girls will not be required to complete the same schedule as the older players.

## Meals and Housing

Participants will be housed in one of the College's residence halls, all of which are within easy walking distance of other facilities that will be used throughout the camp. Most meals are served in Lowry Center dining hall. The food service offers a variety of selections at all-you-can eat meals.
